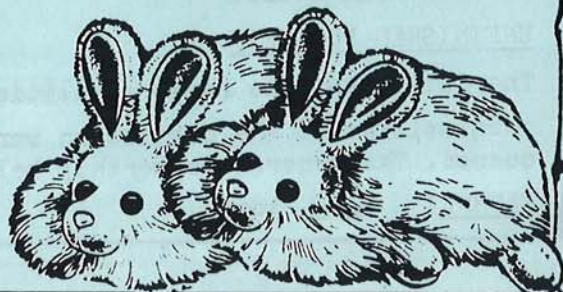

BUDGET FOR 1990:

The President gave a brief explanation of the budget prior to submission to the Board of Directors.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT:

TAMBULI:

Mirla de los Santos, Executive Editor reported that 300 copies of the February issue were mailed. These included free copies to non-members. Due to budget limitation, only one more issue (March) will be mailed to non-members.

BUILDING FUND CAMPAIGN:

Dr. Lillian G. Pardo reported that the committee is now inactive and they need some support to reconstitute its members. She passed some brochures to raise funds for the cultural house.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The duties and the responsibilities of the commissioner to the commission were discussed. The general membership believed

OLD BUSINESS:

NEW BUSINESS:

A fund raising was proposed by George Sorio to sell pizza. Each member is going to sell it and the profit will go direct to the Association. But the members need more information, so they decided to talk about this fund raising on the next general meeting.

Proposal in establishing a profit corporation to fund the association was discussed. The Board of Directors will put this project under further study.

Another fund raising was brought up in the process of voluntarily giving a monetary donation from each member and on every special occasions they will give away prizes through raffles.

CONCESSIONS:

A schedule of the Royals games was passed around. A proposal was made to man the concession once a month preferably a Saturday so the volunteers will have the day to relax. It was also proposed that the committee choose teams that are crowd-getters, like California, New York, etc.

REPAIR OF THE SEWER SYSTEM:

The septic tank needs repair. Dr. Lorenzo informed the body three estimates made by contractors - \$1500.00, \$1200.00 and \$900.00. The estimates will be referred to the Board for approval.

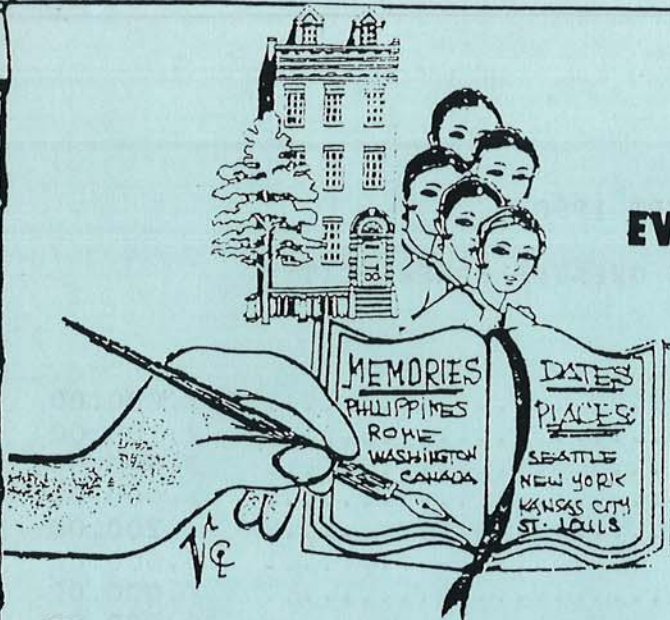

Friends in the Association, once again the Tambuli Editorial Staff invites you to another presentation of the Sunset and Evening Stars. Let's go musical this time for a while. Let's altogether hum a tune or sing-along with me. La a a a Ready? "Those were the days my Friend, we thought they'll never end . . . lala lala lala lala/ lala lala lala/ lala lala/ lala...hm hm hm hm/ hm hm hm Oh, yes, those were the days." Ah, memories, sweet memories of yesteryears that keep and shape the life of our S T A R this month. In the lead role in MEMORIES MEMORIES MEMORIES, is the sweet and amiable, Mrs. Rosario Ongjoco Gomez.

Our STAR was born in San Juan, Rizal, the 3rd in a family of eight. She finished her secondary education at St. Scholastica High School in Mla. and graduated with a degree in Doctor of Dental Medicine from the Philippine Dental College also in Manila in 1951. She left for Guam and joined her sister. She worked for two years before she joined her brother in St. Louis, Mo. in 1955. Charing enrolled at the University of St. Louis and took courses leading to a degree in Bachelor of Arts. At the same time she worked at the Univ. Library - was in charge of acquisition and processing of books, magazines and periodicals.

In one of the private picnics she attended, she met Dr. Gomez of Kansas City. Both fell in love with each other at first sight. They exchanged love letters for two years. On April 4, 1959, they got married at Immaculate Conception Church in St. Louis. After the wedding they left for Kansas City where Dr. Gomez had his private practice in dentistry.

Meanwhile, Charing worked for a while until the couple decided that she stayed at home and wait for the coming to this world of their child, Celeste was born in May 8.

Mrs. Gomez worked at Osteopathic Hosp. for several years as night shift supervisor in the Communications dept. She started working for Mobil Oil Credit Corp. in 1979 and after ten years working in the Customer Mail department, she retired on October 1, 1989.

The Gomezes were very active in many community affairs. In the later 60's when Dr. Gomez was for several times Commander of Bataan Memorial Post 584, the American Legion hosted a lot of dinner dances in which the Filipino Youth Association members were always invited by the Veterans of World War I & II. The young professionals gave life to these parties and made the Old Timers happy by their presence in every activity. In one of the dinner dances hosted by the Legion, the Gomezes led other Filipino couples and friends danced the "Rigodon de Honor", a very popular Phil. folkdance. Charing has been the moving spirit behind her husband in all these affairs.

The Gomezes held several positions with the FAGKC among those were: 1973 Dr. Gomez was the Presidential Adviser while Charing was the Correspondent in the publication of the Tambuli; 1975 Lefty Gomez was Vice-Chair-

man of the Board of Directors; 1977 both Lefty and Charing were chairpersons of the Membership Committee; 1980 Dr. Gomez was once again Vice-Chairman of the Board; 1981 he was a member and in charge of the Senior Citizens Committee during the presidency of Carmen Chico; 1982 Dr. Gomez was a Board member one more time.

Charing never limited her services to any position she held, but also helped other committees that needed help. In a Fiesta Filipina held at Crown Center Square, she helped in the Kitchen Committee. She has also been a big help to Garing Alemania sewing the costumes of the Sinagtala dancers. She has been present in almost all activities sponsored by the FAGKC. Among which are the September Affair which she remembers she just missed twice only because she was out of town; the Easter Picnic at Shelter 2 in Swope Park and she recalls, "It all started as a small group of Filipino families and friends. Each year the attendance grew bigger and bigger until the Gomezes realized that their backyard no longer could hold a big group of Easter party-goers... The FAGKC took over..." she concluded. The Gomezes and the Tabiendos deserve our gratitude for initiating the celebration of Easter at the park.

On February 25, 1988, Dr. Celestino Gomez passed away and the Filipino Association of Greater Kansas City deeply mourns his death, but takes comfort in the many memories he left behind especially in the name of S E R V I C E.

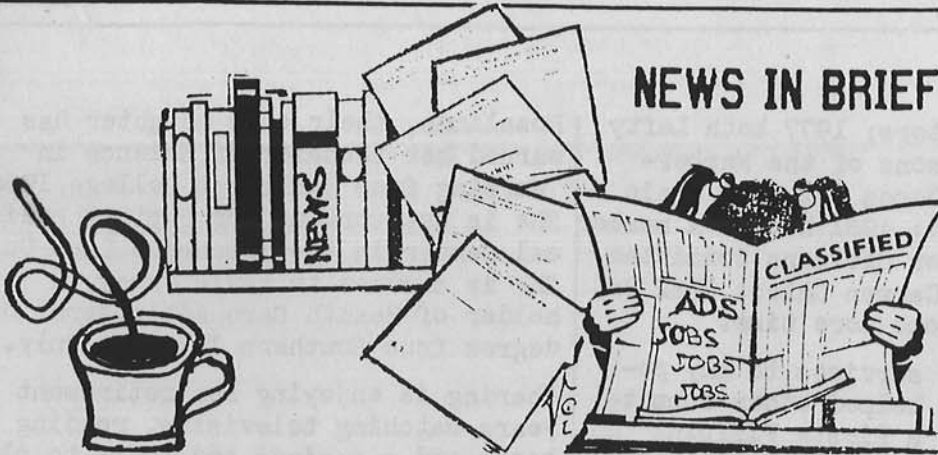

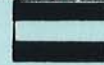

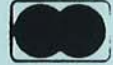
